^b Bureau of Labor Statistics defines Labor Surplus Areas as areas in which the unemployment rate during the two previous years (CY 1995 & 1996) exceeds the national average during that period by 20%. Some cities and places within these counties may not be Labor Surplus Areas. However, based on aggregate county employment figures, the county as a whole would qualify.
