THE GOVERNOR'S PROPOSED BUDGET WOULD CUT IHSS SERVICES FOR NEARLY 400,000 LOW-INCOME SENIORS AND PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

The In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS) Program provides services to low-income seniors and people with disabilities who live in their own homes to help prevent more costly out-of-home care. Governor Schwarzenegger proposes to reduce the number of hours provided for certain non-medical domestic services – including meal preparation, laundry, and errands – by 17.8 percent in 2008-09. This change would reduce IHSS Program funding by \$336.6 million and affect nearly 400,000 vulnerable Californians.
