Even During the Economic Downturn, More Californians Are Working Later in Life

SACRAMENTO -- A new report by the California Budget Project, a nonpartisan public policy research group, shows that the share of Californians age 55 to 69 who are working has increased significantly since the mid-1990s and continued to rise even during the economic downturn.
